NEW AMERICAN LEGION NATIONAL COMMANDER JAMES A. "JIM" LACOURSIERE

During the final hour of the American Legion 105th national convention in New Orleans, LA, Jim LaCoursiere of Connecticut was elected and sworn in as the new leader of The American Legion.

SOUTH DAKOTA RESOLUTIONS AT NATIONAL CONVENTION

The following resolutions were passed at the department convention and forwarded to national for consideration at the 105th National Convention. Disposition is as follows:

<u>SUPPORT OF PROVIDING POSTSECONDARY CREDIT FOR MILITARY SERVICE-</u> That the American Legion supports the establishment of a standardized system to recognize and appropriately award academic credit or certification for military service based on American Council on Education recommendations of evaluation of the Joint Services Transcript System standards. Passed in committee and on the convention floor.

IMPROVING HEALTH AND WELLNESS CARE FOR VETERANS
"An Ounce Of Prevention Is Worth A Pound Of Cure" -call upon the Department of Veterans Affairs to prioritize and enhance health

and wellness care for veterans by including gym memberships as a covered benefit under VA healthcare service. Convention Committee referred to Standing Committee for further study.

AMERICAN LEGION SPONSORING ARMY-NAVY GAME

The American Legion is proud to announce an official partnership with the Army-Navy Football Game presented by USAA, which will be played for the 125th time on Dec. 14, 2024. The American Legion becomes the first veterans service organization (VSO) to sponsor "America's Game" in its history.

The American Legion, the nation's largest veterans service organization, has secured a multi-year deal alongside presenting sponsor USAA and participating partners Chevrolet, Exchange, Duke Cannon Supply Co. and Palantir. The American Legion will also be participating in year-round sponsorships of both Army West Point Athletics and Navy Athletics. The agreement starts with this year's game at Commanders Field in Landover, Md., and helps The American Legion raise awareness about its Be the One mission to reduce the number of veterans and servicemembers lost to suicide.

LEGION INVOLVEMENT IN POLITICS

Article II, Section 2, of the Constitution of The American Legion states, "The American Legion shall be absolutely nonpolitical and shall not be used for the dissemination of partisan principles nor for the promotion of the candidacy of any person seeking public office or preferment." Additionally the National Charter, approved by Congress, stipulates The American Legion as an organization is nonpolitical. Therefore, The American Legion as an organization is never to help or endorse a candidate. As a private citizen and not speaking for the organization, can do whatever is legal and ethical to advance his/her candidacy. If attending a political event, The American Legion cap, or any clothing with The American Legion emblem visible, must be removed so as not to imply any endorsement by The American Legion. This includes in person or over social media.

The American Legion values its independence and effectiveness on veterans' issues. This stance is best maintained by neutrality on all individual candidates or political parties. The American Legion, by legal definition, is non-partisan and supports "or opposes as necessary" only issues which impact the Four Pillars.

LEGION HISTORY

Sept 23, 1804, the Lewis and Clark Expedition made contact with the Lakota Nation for the first time.

Sept 16, 1919 Congress charters The American Legion.

Sept 1932 The Sons of The American Legion is officially recognized during the 1932 National Convention in Portland, Ore

Sept. 1, 1939 Germany invaded Poland, starting World War II.

Sept 2, 1945 Japan formally surrendered to the Allied forces on the USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay, ending World War II.

Sept 18, 1947 The US Air Force was established.

Sept 11, 2001 Nineteen al-Qaeda terrorists hijacked four airplanes, crashing two into the North and South Towers of the World Trade Center and a third plane into the Pentagon. After learning about the other attacks, passengers on the fourth plane, Flight 93, fought back, and the plane crashed into an empty field in western Pennsylvania. The attacks killed 2,977 people from 90 nations: 2,753 people were killed in New York; 184 people were killed at the Pentagon; and 40 people were killed on Flight 93.
