124 boys participated in the 82nd session of South Dakota Boys State, Brody Tyana of Sioux Falls, O'Gorman HS, was elected Governor (\$1,000 Gene and Carla Opbroek Scholarship). Elected Lt. Governor was Ivan Stuwe of Hoven HS. Alex Smith of SF Lutheran HS and Lewis Carlyle of RC Stevens HS were selected as the delegates to Boys Nation (\$1,000 scholarship each). NAT CDR POST EXCELLENCE AWARD

To qualify, a post is required to achieve excellence in four areas: 1) At least 103% of their membership goal. At least one post officer attends district meetings. 2) Consolidated Post Report submitted by July 1. 3) Renew at least 90% of their 2024 members. 4) Conduct an event that connects the community and Post.

District Commanders are responsible for the post will certify a post as having achieved the four specified criteria and submit to Dept HQ. List should include the post name, phone number, address, and commander's name. If possible, attach copies of press

releases. Dept HQ will send Posts that qualify to National HQ.

ALL AMERICAN LEGION POSTS TO FILE IRS FORM 990

Federal tax regulations require every Post to file IRS form 990. This must be filled out by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of your organizations accounting period. If the IRS does not receive this form, they will revoke the tax-exempt status of the Post. To get your Tax-exempt status back you have to apply and pay a fee. JULY HISTORY

July 4, 1776: Happy Birthday America. Yay no taxes!

July 1, 1862: President Abraham Lincoln signed the first income tax bill. Nuts, taxes!

July 1-3, 1863: The Battle of Gettysburg, the deadliest battle in all of American military history with over 50,000 combined casualties. July 9, 1919: The Legion emblem was officially adopted by the National Executive Committee

July 17, 1925: American Legion Baseball is foundered in Milbank program. Today, more than 50 percent of Major League Baseball players are graduates of the program. About 82,000 youths play on Legion-sponsored teams each year.

July 22, 1927: Commander Travers D. Carmen awarded Charles Lindbergh the Legion's first "Distinguished Service Medal."

July 21, 1930: Pres. Hoover signed Ex. Order 5398, consolidating three agencies administering Veterans benefits programs into a single entity called the Veterans Administration.

July 28, 1932: The U.S. Army attacked the Bonus Army a group of World War I veterans in Washington D.C. with tanks, bayonets, and tear gas, under the leadership of Douglas MacArthur, George Patton, and Dwight D. Eisenhower.

July 10-13, 1938: The 20th Annual Convention of the American Legion Department of South Dakota is held in Aberdeen. Turner Rudesill of Rapid City Post 22 is elected Department Commander.

July 16, 1945 - The first atomic bomb "Fat Boy" was set off at 5:30am in the New Mexico desert.

July 9, 1954: The American Legion Child Welfare Foundation is formed. *Today, more than \$11 million has been awarded to youth organizations and projects designed to help America's children.*

July 20, 1969: Neil Armstrong took man's first steps on the moon. July 21, 1983: The Legion announces its sponsorship of an independent study on the effects of exposure to Agent Orange on Vietnam War veterans. Congress receives the results of the "American Legion-Columbia University Study of Vietnam-era Veterans" in 1989.

July 2016: The Legacy Scholarship is expanded to children of post-9/11 veterans who have a VA disability rating of 50 percent or more. July 30, 2019: The LEGION Act is signed extending wartime service to cover previously unrecognized periods. The act allows veterans who served outside of the previously designated war eras to join The American Legion.
