LEGION INVOLVEMENT IN POLITICS

Article II, Section 2, of the Constitution of The American Legion states, "The American Legion shall be absolutely nonpolitical and shall not be used for the dissemination of partisan principles nor for the promotion of the candidacy of any person seeking public office or preferment." Additionally the National Charter, approved by Congress, stipulates The American Legion as an organization is nonpolitical. Therefore, The American Legion as an organization is never to help or endorse a candidate. As a private citizen and not speaking for the organization, can do whatever is legal and ethical to advance his/her candidacy. If attending a political event, The American Legion cap, or any clothing with The American Legion emblem visible, must be removed so as not to imply any endorse-

ment by The American Legion. This includes in person or over social media.

The American Legion values its independence and effectiveness on veterans' issues. This stance is best maintained by neutrality on all individual candidates or political parties. The American Legion, by legal definition, is non-partisan and supports "or opposes as necessary" only issues which impact the Four Pillars.

NAT CDR POST EXCELLENCE AWARD

To qualify, a post is required to achieve excellence in four areas: 1) At least 103% of their membership goal. At least one post officer attends district meetings. 2) Consolidated Post Report submitted by July 1. 3) Renew at least 90% of their 2024 members. 4) Conduct an event that connects the community and Post.

District Commanders are responsible for the post will certify a post as having achieved the four specified criteria and submit to Dept HQ. List should include the post name, phone number, address, and commander's name. If possible, attach copies of press releases. Dept HQ will send Posts that qualify to National HQ.

NAT CDR 103% MEMBERSHIP DOG TAG COIN

ALL AMERICAN LEGION POSTS TO FILE IRS FORM 990

Federal tax regulations require every Post to file IRS form 990. This must be filled out by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of your organizations accounting period. If the IRS does not receive this form, they will revoke the tax-exempt status of the Post. To get your Tax-exempt status back you have to apply and pay a fee. JULY HISTORY

Aug 2, 1776 - Most of the 55 members of the Continental Congress signed the parchment copy of the Declaration of Independence.

Aug 24-26, 1920 The Second Annual Convention of the American Legion Department of South Dakota took place in Watertown. After L.L. Stephens of Pierre withdrew from the race, Fred B. Ray of Yankton was elected Department Commander. Ray lied about his age to join the Army in 1898 at the age of 15 where he served time in the Philippines. In WWI he served as the Regimental Commander of both the 135th Infantry and the 133rd Infantry. Ray is one of two Commanders to serve as Department Commander for two years.

Aug 6, 1941 First atomic bomb was dropped on Hiroshima, Japan. Aug 9, 1941 Second atomic bombing of Japan occurred as an American B-29 bomber headed for the city of Kokura, but because of poor visibility then chose a secondary target, Nagasak.

Aug 10-13, 1941 The Twenty-third Annual Convention of the American Legion Department of South Dakota took place in Huron. Department Commander Mumford presided and Claude Hamilton of Sioux Falls is elected Department Commander. The Boys State report given by Dr, Harry Darling 274 boys attend the second session that year. Phil Boerger was elected as Boys State Governor and with in two years he was drafted into WWII. Boerger would go on to graduate from West Point and later retire from the US Army at the rank of Brigadier General.

Aug 24, 1969 Legion's National Executive Committee establishes the National Emergency Fund as a result of Hurricane Camille.

Aug 2, 1990 The Legion files suit against the federal government for failure to conduct a Congress-mandated study about the effects of

Agent Orange on veterans who served in Vietnam.

Aug 2, 1990 Iraqi forces invade Kuwait

Aug 16, 2017 The Harry W. Colmery Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2017 – also known as the "Forever GI Bill" because it removes time limits for veterans who wish to use it for college – is signed into law by President Donald J. Trump. The legislation is named for The American Legion past national commander who in the winter of 1943-44 drafted the Servicemen's Readjustment Act that changed the nation after World War II.

Here's a shortened version that preserves the heart of Wayne "Red" Vetter's life and legacy:

IN LOVING MEMORY OF WAYNE VETTER

Wayne "Red" Erich Vetter, 82, of Cresbard, passed away July 15, 2025.

Born May 19, 1943, in Redfield to Alfred and Louise Vetter, Wayne served 27 years in the U.S. Army & National Guard, retiring as Sergeant 1st Class. He was a lifelong member of the American Legion, Legion Riders, and 40 & 8.

Wayne married Barbara Heidenreich in 1973, and together they raised three sons in Cresbard. He worked in law enforcement for 23 years, retiring as Chief Deputy, then served 13



A passionate advocate for veterans, Wayne served as American Legion State Commander and helped honor local hero Cecil E. Harris. He led efforts to build the Cresbard Community Center and Veterans Memorial, and ran several local businesses including a laundromatturned-rec center and a SteamX franchise.

Wayne loved farming, raising cattle, hunting, fishing, and guiding pheasant hunts. He cherished time with his family, especially his grandchildren, and was a proud supporter of their activities.

He is survived by his wife Barb; sons Eric, Joel, and Chad; grandchildren Carstyn, Taylor, Adyson, Austin, and Creightyn; sister Carol; and many extended family and friends. He was preceded in death by his parents, siblings, in-laws, and close friends.

Wayne lived a life of service, dedication, and love. "28-1B your watch is over." He now watches over us from above.

IN LOVING MEMORY OF STEVE STIER

On July 29, 2025, we lost a truly remarkable man—District 3 Commander Steve Stier. A devoted husband, father, Legionnaire, and friend, Steve touched countless lives with his kindness, humor, and unwavering dedication. He will be deeply missed.

Born in Elbow Lake, MN, Steve grew up in Chokio, where he shared a lively childhood with his brothers Mark, Matthew, Patrick, and Bradley, and lovingly watched over his sister Lisa. He found his greatest treasure in Mary Jo, the love of his life, and together they built a beautiful 35 w



of his life, and together they built a beautiful 35-year journey in Onida, SD, raising their children Michael "Gooser" and Katherine "Girly."

Steve served his community and country through the Onida Fire Department, the 200th Engineer Company, and the American Legion. Whether as a coach, mentor, or friend, he was known for his generous spirit, infectious laughter, and legendary rhubarb jelly. His presence made the world brighter for everyone around him.
