NOVEMBER HISTORY

Nov 10, 1775- the 2nd Continental Congress resolved to raise two battalions of Marines. Commissioning Samuel Nicholas as captain of the fledgling force of Continental Marines. From Tun Tavern (*yes, a bar*) in Philadelphia, Nicholas raised two battalions and began the long illustrious history of the United States Marine Corps. **Nov 25, 1783** - At the end of the Revolutionary War, the last British troops left New York City.

Nov 26, 1863 - President Abraham Lincoln made Thanksgiving Day official in 1863. He declared a national day of Thanksgiving for the last Thursday of November each year.

Nov 11, 1885– GEN George S. Patton Jr. born in San Gabriel, CA Nov 11, 1918– Veterans Day, originally "Armistice Day" commemorating the end of World War I, now a day to honor all American Veterans

Nov 10-12, 1919- The 1st American Legion National Convention. Membership at this point exceeds 684,000. Among the delegates are 140 women veterans of World War I, and The Constitution and Preamble are adopted. Delegates consider 350 resolutions but approve only 50, including equal treatment for women who served in the war, employment programs for veterans, fair government benefits for those who came home disabled from service, support for the Boy Scouts, mandatory patriotic exercises in schools and the establishment of an air branch of service.

Nov 11, 1921-American Legion leaders join Allied generals and President Warren G. Harding in ceremonies to dedicate the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery. The tomb was the culmination of Legion-supported legislation introduced by U.S. Rep. Hamilton Fish, Jr., a founder of the organization.

Nov 8, 1942 - Operation Torch, the Allied landings in North Africa, began as 400,000 soldiers under the command of General Dwight D. Eisenhower landed at Morocco and Algeria.

Nov 22, 1963– President John F. Kennedy assassination. Kennedy was a member of Somerville, Massachusetts Post 281 and spoke at the SD Dept Convention in June 19, 1960 in Sioux Falls.

Nov 11, 1972 - The U.S. turned over its military base at Long Binh to the South Vietnamese, symbolizing the end of direct American military participation in the Vietnam War.

Nov 4, 1979 - About 500 Iranian militants stormed the U.S. Embassy in Teheran, Iran, taking 90 hostages, including 52

Americans that they held captive for 444 days.

Nov 9, 1989 - The beginning of the destruction of the Berlin Wall and the Iron Curtain. East Berlin transit restrictions were overwhelmed, discarded and sections of the wall were breached.

NATIONAL COMMANDER'S INCENTIVE PROGRAM

National Commander Dan Wiley will award his national commander **Be the One membership incentive pin** to any Legionnaire who obtains two new Legion members. A new member is any eligible person joining for the 26 membership year who was not a member of during the 25 membership year. Transfers do not count. **Download the form**

103% Membership Award- National Commander Wiley will award his Be the One membership incentive pin to any post commander, district commander, county commander, department commander or membership chairman who achieves 103% of their assigned membership goal for 2026. Download Award Form
Post Excellence Award- To qualify a post must achieve in four areas: membership, Consolidated Post Report, 90% renewal rate, and community activity. Standard to be achieved in each area is:

- 1. Membership: 103% of Post goal. At least one post officer attends district meetings.
- 2. Consolidated Post Report: CPRs must be submitted by July 1.
- 3. <u>90% Renewal: Of their members that were on the 2024 roster.</u>
- 4. <u>Community Activity:</u> The post must conduct an event that connects the local community with The American Legion post.

Certification for the award: The district commander responsible for the post will certify a post and submit to Dept HQ.

100% American Legion Family Ribbon

Commander Wiley will award his 100% American Legion Family Ribbon to any American Legion Family that achieves 100% membership by the 2026 100% membership target date.
