

THE AMERICAN LEGION LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP

This needs-based scholarship designed to fulfill a financial gap remaining after all federal and state educational grants/scholarships available to an eligible applicant have been utilized. Children of post-9/11 veterans having been assigned a combined disability rating of 50 percent or greater or who died while on active duty on or after Sept. 11, 2001, are eligible. All applications new or renewal must be submitted using the online scholarship submission system beginning January 1 and NO LATER THAN Wednesday, March 25, 2026. Total amount of scholarship funds awarded in 2024: \$1,645,558.

National Commander Dan Wiley will award his national commander **Be the One membership incentive pin** to any Legionnaire who obtains two new Legion members. A new member is for the 2026 membership year who was not a member of during

103% Membership Award- Commander Wiley will award his Be the One membership incentive pin to any post, county, district, or department or membership chair who achieves 103% of their assigned membership goal for 2026. [Download Award Form](#)

To qualify for the **Post Excellence Award** a post must achieve in four areas: membership, Consolidated Post Report, 90% renewal rate, and community activity. Standard to be achieved is:

1. Membership: 103% of Post goal. At least one post officer attends district meetings.
2. Consolidated Post Report: CPRs must be submitted by July 1.
3. 90% Renewal: Of their members that were on the 2024 roster.
4. Community Activity: The post must conduct an event that connects the local community with The American Legion post.

Certification for the award: The district commander responsible for the post will certify a post and submit to Dept HQ.

100% American Legion Family Ribbon

Commander Wiley will award his 100% American Legion Family Ribbon to any American Legion Family that achieves 100% membership by the 2026 100% membership target date.

SCOUTS' VET GRAVE DOCUMENTATION EFFORT

A group of Eagle Scouts in Sioux Falls is leading an impressive project to document the graves of veterans buried in civilian cemeteries—and their work is already making an impact.

The Scouts have photographed headstones, recorded GPS coordinates, and gathered service details for every veteran they can identify. Their goal is to upload this information to the **Veterans Legacy Memorial (VLM)**, the VA's online platform that preserves veterans' stories. Many entries on the VLM are incomplete or missing entirely, and the Scouts' work helps families, researchers, and communities locate and honor these veterans more accurately.

All Sioux Falls cemeteries and several around Hartford have already been completed, and the idea is spreading—another Scout in Virginia has begun a similar effort. The hope is that youth groups, schools, and veterans' organizations, including local Legion posts, will join in. Legion members are especially well-positioned to help identify veterans and guide documentation in their communities.

This project also highlights the need to educate veterans and families about VLM and how they can update or add information about their loved ones. With America's 250th anniversary approaching, this effort could become a meaningful statewide contribution to preserving veterans' legacies.
