Legionnaires Elect Dennis Brenden 2018-2019 Department Commander

Dennis Brenden, of Watertown, was elected as the 2018-2019 Department Commander of The American Legion Department of South Dakota during the closing moments of the 100th Annual Department Convention in Spearfish, SD on June 10, 2018. Brenden was nominated by Paul Evenson of Garretson, and his nomination was seconded by Larry Price of Redfield.

Denny Brenden graduated from High School in Hayti, SD, in 1968. Following graduation, at the age of 18, he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps and served one year in Vietnam as a

rifleman

Denny is a 48- year continuous member of The American Legion and is currently a member of Codington County American Legion Post #17 in Watertown, SD. Denny is a life member of The American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans, Vietnam Veterans of America and the Marine Corps League. He is also a member of the 40&8. Denny has been married to his wife Roxy for 46 years and they have three grown children, 16 grandchildren with 9 boys and 7 girls. Denny and Roxy reside in Watertown, SD, and are members of the Hosanna Lutheran Church in Watertown.

On Thursday, June 7, the state convention activities kicked off with a meeting of the Department Finance Commission where Department Finance Officer Gary Wolkow briefed the Department Finance Commission on the status of the current budget and following their meeting, the Department Executive Committee met in the Spearfish Convention Center. Later that same afternoon, the 5-Year Membership Council and Public Relations/Media Committee held their joint meeting.

On Friday morning, June 8, the Convention Resolutions Committee, led by committee chairman Denny Brenden of Watertown, met to assign resolutions to the various convention committees. This year, the Convention Resolutions Committee referred a total of two resolutions to the convention committees. All nine Convention Committees met early in the afternoon to act on any resolutions assigned to their respective convention committee.

The South Dakota American Legion Press Association (SDALPA) held their annual luncheon and business meeting in the Cottonwood room at the Spearfish Convention Center. Charemon Dunham of Iroquois, SD, was elected to serve as the SDALPA President in 2018 -2019.

On Friday evening, the Go-Getter Smorgasbord was held at the Western Heritage Center in Spearfish and as always, the event was very well attended by the Go-Getters and everyone had a great time. The unique setting gave everyone a chance to mingle and learn a new fact or two. Again this year, a "fun auction" was held and the proceeds were \$5999.60. An auction highlight again this year, was a John Green original print featuring the Centennial Celebration that was auctioned off. Pat Huls of Madison was the top bidder for the print and is now the proud owner of four original John Green prints from the fun auction.

Sisseton-Wahpeton Sioux Veterans Cemetery Opens

Sisseton—The Sisseton-Wahpeton Sioux tribe celebrated the grand opening of a brand new veteran's cemetery on July 12, 2018. It's the 3rd tribal burial ground in the state, but it will honor veterans of every background. Dignitaries from Tribal and civic leadership, the National Cemetery Association, the Department of Veterans Affairs, the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs, the South Dakota American Legion, and various other Veteran Service Organizations were in attendance for the opening ceremonies. Remarks were made by representatives from Senator John Thune and Representative Kristi Noem's office.

A \$3 million grant from the department of veteran affairs and the national cemetery association helped complete the vision of the cemetery. The cemetery is twenty acres in length and is located across the street from the Valley View Golf Course in Sisseton. The state's Dakota tribe gifted the land to the Sisseton-Wahpeton tribal community.

SD American Legion Donates Flag Pole to Boys State

ABERDEEN, S.D. – A brand new U.S. flag will fly at Northern State University's new Athletic and Recreation Fields, thanks to the South Dakota American Legion.

The Legion is donating a flag, pole and pedestal for the project on the NSU campus. Director Gene Opbroek said the gift is a testament to the great relationship the Legion has with Northern, which is home to the Boys State program.

"We just thought it was time that we put something there to honor not only the Legion but the Boys State attendees for the last 76 years," said Boys State Director Gene Opbroek.

Opbroek said the Legion planned to seek outside donations to fund the gift, but it wasn't necessary: Members stepped up at the annual convention and said they were happy to support



The flag pole will stand at the site of one of Northern's newest projects, currently under construction east of Jerde Hall. The Athletic and Recreation Fields will be finished by fall and will include a soccer competition field, football practice field and pavilion.

The project is part of the Educational Impact Campaign, NSU's joint effort with the South Dakota School for the Blind and Visually Impaired (SDSBVI), which also includes a new SDSBVI facility and on-campus regional sports complex.

SD American Legion Donates \$50,000 to East River State Veterans Cemetery Endowment

SIOUX FALLS, S.D. - Keloland News reports that hundreds of thousands of dollars in donations are coming in from a variety of groups including Avera, Sanford, the American Legion and more. The money will help support a proposed state Veterans cemetery in northern Sioux Falls. That is the beginning of a parade

of donations to the state Veterans cemetery endowment fund. Veteran and Dr. Barry Martin with Avera Health says the organization is pledging \$250,000 to the fund. Sanford Health is also pitching in

Sanford Health is also pitching in \$50,000 right now. Its Director of Veteran and Military Services says the proposed cemetery means a lot for all Veterans, past and present.

The goal is to raise \$3 million in five years. The endowment fund will cover operating costs of the cemetery once it's built. A preapplication for a roughly \$6 million grant has been submitted to the National Cemetery Administration. That money would cover the construction costs of the cemetery

tery.

"The 19,000 members of the American Legion in South Dakota are really proud to present this check for this project. There will probably be more coming. In fact we have a post very near Fort Meade and the Black Hills National Cemetery, that donated \$1,500," Jim Huls with the South Dakota American Legion.

Disabled American Veterans are also presenting a check for \$25,000 and even more funding is coming in from the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Paralyzed Veterans of America, the Military Order of the Purple Heart and Vietnam Vets. South Dakota is one of five states in the country without a state Veterans cemetery.

For the past 21 months I have had the unique perspective of observing interactions at meetings of all levels while still being the "new guy". I have heard the frustrations of members who say the young members just won't join. I have seen the meetings where we all sit in our cliques, you can put a label on any of them, from Post, District, branch of service, war-era to generational. By human nature we all tend to go to our "comfort zones". As we turn the focus to the future, we must be able to get out of our comfort zones, talk with those who are coming up into our organization; that by definition are "young".

There is no single answer to recruiting a new member into our organization, which makes it a challenge. In "sales" there are a few things you must always have. 1. have some sort of rapport with them (by talking with them and having something in common). 2. understand the prospect's needs. 3. know enough about our organization to be able to provide the answers on how our organization can fulfil their need(s).

Having a conversation with the veteran is key to learning about them, without this, you will not be able to go anywhere. Questions such as: are they married, kids, what job do they do, do they have fellow veterans they are friends with, what branch of service, did they deploy? The list of questions can continue depending on the person's level of opening up. When having a conversation, each person is learning about the other. It should be a mutual conversation and not one where you overload them with an interrogation. Bring in the comradery into the mix of our meetings and how we all assist each other in our personal lives.

Collecting the dues is just the first step of having a new member. Do not forget there is a backside to those applications where the new member has a chance to "volunteer" into something they are interested in. We lose a lot of new members by not making them feel like they belong in "OUR" organization. Inviting them into meetings, coffee social hours, to events to pay respects to those who have fallen is a vital next step. Find out when they have time in their busy schedules to fit in the American Legion family, then change your schedule, if you can, to give them an opportunity to participate.

A century ago the forefathers of our organization likely didn't know how long this organization would last. What they did initially in their meetings and communities is not the same as it is now. Times change and with that so do we. The "senior" leadership of our Posts is a valuable asset that we need, the "junior" members are an asset we should embrace and mentor, so the Four Pillars of "OUR" organization will remain the common bond that makes all of us Legionnaires. Sturgis Guardsman Takes Home Top Honors as Army National Guard's Soldier of the Year

South Dakota National Guard's Spc. Bailey Ruff, of Sturgis, has won the 2018 Army National Guard Best Warrior Competition. On July 27th, Ruff was announced as the Army National Guard's Soldier of the Year after competing this week against Soldiers from across the country in Fort Indiantown Gap, Pennsylvania. Ruff is the first SDNG Soldier to win this title and advance to the Department of the Army's Best Warrior Competition at Fort A.P. Hill, Virginia, and the Pentagon later this fall.

The premier Army competition, 22 of the Army's finest warriors, representing 11 commands from across the Army, will compete in the 2018 Best Warrior Competition at Fort A.P. Hill, Va., and the Pentagon from Sept. 30 to Oct. 5, 2018. Sgt. Maj. of the Army Daniel Dailey will oversee the 17th annual competition, which names the Department of the Army's Soldier and Noncommissioned Officer of the Year.

Warriors selected to compete for these prestigious titles - 11 Soldiers and 11 NCOs - have already mastered a series of benchmarks throughout the year to qualify for the DA-level competition.

During the six-day competition, these elite competitors will test their knowledge, skills and abilities by conquering urban warfare simulations, demonstrating critical thinking, formal board interviews, physical fitness challenges, written exams, and warrior tasks and battle drills relevant to today's operating environment. Another state convention in the books! It was wonderful seeing you all out in the Hills. A big thanks to the hospitality shown by District 1; I look forward to returning for Midwinter! Congratulations to State Commander Denny Brenden on being elected State Commander for the Department of South Dakota, as well as all others elected to leadership positions.

I've heard time and time again that posts are having trouble reaching out to younger veterans. In my experience, one of the best ways to reach out to my generation is to provide them with resources—make it clear that you have the knowledge, awareness and/or connections to help them in their everyday lives. One of the best ways to do that is to utilize the post Service Officer position: know your county service officer, know what programs are available, and know where to point a veteran when they need help. You don't need to be the expert, but you should know where the experts are. Be willing to go to an appointment or two with your County Veterans Service Officer if your veteran isn't comfortable, or doesn't know what questions to ask. Now, lets arm you with a few talk-

For those who served near them, the smell of the burn pits is unforgettable. As it turns out, there's potentially something more sinister in that smoke—it's possible that burn pits could have caused or will cause health issues in Southwest Asia Veterans. If you or someone you know served in Southwest Asia since 1991, please take the time to complete the VA Burn Pit Registry at https:// veteran.mobilehealth.va.gov/AHBurnPitRegistry/.

While there is not enough medical or scientific information to conclude that long-term health effects have occurred due to burn pit smoke, VA continues to study the health of deployed Veterans. Veterans and Servicemembers who were closer to burn pit smoke or exposed for longer periods may be at greater risk for health problems. Individual health effects will vary and may depend on a number of other factors, such as the type of waste being burned and wind direction. According to a 2011 Institute of Medicine report, the high level of fine dust and pollution common in Iraq and Afghanistan may pose a greater danger for respiratory illnesses than exposure to burn pits.

There are, however, already established presumptive diseases for those who have served in the Southwest Asia theater of operations since 1990. These include Chronic Fatigue Syndrome, Fibromyalgia, Functional Gastrointestinal Disorders, and Undiagnosed Illnesses with symptoms that may include but are not limited to: abnormal weight loss, fatigue, cardiovascular disease, muscle and joint pain, headache, menstrual disorders, neurological and psychological problems, skin conditions, respiratory disorders, and sleep disturbances.

Help younger veterans find the help they've earned—many are unaware that presumptives exist in the VA for Gulf War eras. Go into conversations armed with knowledge, and you might come out one member stronger.

Doug Harris of Post 22 Selected to **Attend National Legion College**

This year, The American Legion Department of South Dakota had three Legionnaires that applied to attend the 2018 National Legion College in Indianapolis, Indiana.

A panel of Past Department Commanders reviewed all three applications during the state convention in Spearfish and recommended Doug Harris of Rapid City to be the Department's first choice selection to attend the National Legion College. Also, the Department submitted the application for Matt Lagerstrom of White, SD, the National American Legion College as an attendee. Both applicants qualify under the guidelines for the National Legion College and both applications will be forwarded to the National American Legion College Screening Committee for their consideration.



Each department is allowed one applicant to attend but other applications will be considered and may be accepted by the National American Legion College Screening Committee depending on the number of applicants.

The final selections will be announced by National Headquarters shortly after the conclusion of the 100th annual American Legion National Convention held in Minneapolis, MN August 24-30, 2018.

The 2018 National American Legion College will be a week long, in-depth course of instruction on The American Legion. The college is a combination of lectures, small group workshops, and practical exercises. Students will receive training in leadership, sales and marketing, communication and fundraising. Focus is on self-taught small group sessions under the supervision of graduate facilitators, national staff members and national officers

Department of South Dakota Emergency Fund Established

The Department Executive Committee has established a Department Emergency Fund. Previously known as the Emergency Relief Fund, the renamed fund has a quick-acting team of three, consisting of the Finance Officer, Department Commander and Department Adjutant. This fund is to be used similar to the National Emergency fund—its goal is to provide temporary relief to veterans who are residents of our State or American Legion Posts when a disaster strikes. Unlike the Temporary Financial Assistance program, veterans are not required to have dependents to be eligible.

Monies expended from this fund will be limited to around \$300 per veteran in time of need. There must be money in the account before any funds can be expended. The current balance is \$1,229 and will be replenished by donations only. This would be a great program to support for any Post, Squadron, or Rider Chapter.






