#### MISTAKE IN THE LAST UP TO NOW.

In the last Up To Now, a message from U.S. Army TACOM was included about asset/rifle inventories. We were mistakenly informed to include that email to the Posts. It was discovered the included instructions only went to one specific post page. We recontacted TACOM and addressed the issue and they ask that the following be sent to all the posts. "The Army Donations Program Office (ADPO) received an inquiry from your office about the digitization of records and the new method to reporting rifles known as an Asset Certification. The ADPO still accepts physical inventories as not all posts/organizations have email addresses. However, it is highly recommended posts/organizations utilize an Asset Certification to report Ceremonial Rifles and/or Static Displays. A post/organization email address is the only thing required to have an Asset Certification generated. NOTE: The

Asset Certification only allows one email address to be utilized. Best of all – An Asset Certification does not require a notary. Ceremonial Rifles are to be reported every 3 years. Static Displays (Tank, Helicopter, Howitzer, etc.) are reported every year. The bottom line here is TACOM hopes all posts will get an email on record so they can utilize the digital system. However, a paper report is still acceptable.
