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II. MINIMUM ANNUAL REQUIREMENTS OF A POST

A. POST DATA REPORT - Due April 15, 2025

Post Data Reports are mailed to all Posts in February with the Up To Now. Complete the form and mail to Dept HQ as soon as possible. This form confirms the Post address as well as dues and is very important to return even if nothing has changed.

B. CONSOLIDATED POST REPORTS - Due June 1, 2025

The Consolidated Post Report is used to collect data of what the Post has accomplished that year. The form is mailed to posts in the Up To Now, is on the Department website at under forms (<u>Fillable CPR</u>) or can be accessed on MyLegion. The data is collected at National Headquarters for use by the Commander to report the activities of The American Legion to congress.

C. FILE A 990 WITH THE IRS

Tax-exempt organizations must file an annual information return with the IRS. Form 990 is the IRS' primary tool for gathering information about tax-exempt organizations, educating organizations about tax law and compliance. D. FILE AN ANNUAL REPORT WITH THE SOUTH DAKOTA SECRETARY OF STATE

Annually the Secretary of State requires filing for corporations including non-profits, to maintain good standing with the state. Annual Reports contain basic information about an organization, such as its principal address, registered agent, and officers. E. OFFICER'S CERTIFICATION - <u>Due following elections</u>

Certification of Officers is required annually to update Dept HQ of the Post's Leadership. Post Adjutants verify the military service records of the officers and committee chairpersons of the Post for that year. Send certification to Dept HQ as soon as elections are complete. Dept HQ needs to know who the post officers are for the coming year even if they are the same as before. **DO NOT MARK "SAME AS LAST YEAR**" complete the whole form.

III. COMMUNITY & ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

The following awards are selected at the Department level with several program winners being forwarded to National Headquarters to compete at that level. Each Post should select an awardee at the local level and forward their nomination to their District for all awards except employment awards, NLEOY, NFY. District Commanders shall select a District winner and forward their nomination to the Department based on required timelines for each award. Additional information on each award and "how-to" instructions can be found on the Department Website under the "FORMS" tab.

A. THE AMERICAN LEGION NATIONAL VETERANS EMPLOYMENT & EDUCATION COMMISSION AWARDS – *November 15th*

These awards are selected at the Department level and winners are forwarded to the National level. Nominations are due to Department Headquarters no later than <u>November 15th.</u> Additional information can be found on the Department website. There are nine different awards given by the National commission:

- 1. Employer of Veterans Award (small) (company with 50 or fewer employees)
- 2. Employer of Veterans Award (medium) (company with 51-200 employees)
- 3. Employer of Veterans Award (large) (company with 201 or more employees)
- 4. Employment Service Award (LVER) Local Veterans Employment Representative
- 5. Employment Service Award (DVOP) Disabled Veterans Outreach Program specialist
- 6. Employment Service Award (Local office)
- 7. Employer of Older Workers Award
- 8. Enhance the Lives of Disabled Person Award
- 9. Michael Guty Homeless Veterans Out-Reach Award.

B. NATIONAL FIREFIGHTER/EMT OF THE YEAR (NFY) - <u>December 31st</u>

This award recognizes the professionalism and dedication of a firefighter. The Department winner will compete at the National level. Nomination packages cover the period of 1 July to 30 June. Send nominations to Dept HQ by December 31st.

C. DEPARTMENT EMT OF THE YEAR - December 31st

This award recognizes the professionalism and dedication of an Emergency Medical Technician. Nomination covers the time period of 1 July to 30 June. Nominations should be submitted directly to Department Headquarters by December 31st.

D. NATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF THE YEAR (NLEOY) - <u>December 31st.</u>

This award recognizes the professionalism and dedication of a law enforcement officer. The Department winner is submitted to compete at the National level. Nomination packages cover the time period of 1 July to 30 June. Nominations are submitted directly to Department Headquarters by December 31st.

E. EAGLE SCOUT OF THE YEAR - March 1st

This award is presented annually at the department convention. Additional information on the program can be found on the sdlegion.org website under programs. The award application is also found in the Scouting program on the website. Award applications are due March 1st.

F. SOUTH DAKOTA AMERICAN LEGION EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR AWARD - <u>10 days prior</u> <u>to Spring District Convention</u>.

This department level award recognizes a dedicated and devoted teacher who gives of themselves on behalf of the children of South Dakota. Posts submit this award to their District Commander no later than 10 days prior to their Spring District Convention. District Commanders will ensure their nominees are forwarded to the Department by May 1st.

G. SOUTH DAKOTA AMERICAN LEGION GOOD SAMARITAN AWARD - <u>10 days prior to Spring District Convention.</u>

This award recognizes individuals or groups who give of themselves to help others. Post must submit this award to their District Commander no later than 10 days prior to their Spring District Convention. District Commanders are responsible for ensuring their nominees are forwarded to the Department by May 1st.

H. POST AMERICANISM REPORT/COMPETITION - May 1st

The following Americanism awards will be presented to those outstanding Posts that go "above and beyond" (judged using your submissions on the Post Americanism Report) for their communities:

- 1. **Timeframe**: Include all activities from April 1st March 31st. Reports are due to Headquarters May 1st. The competition criteria required for any of these groups is listed on the Post Americanism Report (below). The Post Americanism report can also be found at the following link: https://www.sdlegion.org/post-adjutant-manual-forms/. There is an instruction sheet (ONLINE) to explain each section of the report in order to help you properly complete the document.
 - 2. The competition is broken out into five (5) Post size groups:
 - 1) 15-45 2) 46-74 3) 75-124 4) 125-350 5) 351+
 - a. **Annual Americanism Citation** Every Post that submits an Americanism form will receive a certificate from National.
 - b. **Golden Eagle Award** is awarded to the Post in each goal size group that submits the best overall Americanism program. This is based on active participation and documentation of those activities.
 - c. **Distinguished Service Citation** is awarded to the post in each department that conducts the most outstanding Americanism and Community Service activity.
 - d. Meritorious Service Citation is awarded to the runner-up in each department.
 - e. **Americanism Officer Of The Year** is awarded to the Post Americanism Officer of the Post that wins the Distinguished Service Citation.

I. WILLIAM LENKER VA&R AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE - May 1st

All posts do great things to support veterans and rehabilitation. This award is open to all posts in the Department regardless of goal size and all posts compete on an equal basis. This award application is available on the department website under forms and is due to headquarters by May 1st. The winning post will be recognized on stage at the department convention.

J. OUTSTANDING DISTRICT COMMANDER AWARD (ODCA)

The District Commander's duties are broad and difficult. The commander must lead and navigate their district and serve as part of the Department Executive Committee. The District Commander is charged with the oversight of operation of District. The selection of this award will be completed by the Department Vice-Commanders and Department Adjutant. Winner will be recognized at the annual Department Convention.

K. SOUTH DAKOTA AMERICAN LEGION PRESS ASSOCIATION (SDALPA) ANNUAL NEWSPA-PER CONTEST - two weeks prior to Department Convention.

Each year SDALPA judges Newsletters or Newspapers produced by Posts. The award is presented annually at the

Department Convention. Posts wishing to enter the contest must submit copies of their newsletter/newspaper two weeks prior to the start of the Department Convention. Additional information can be found on the Department website under publications/SD Legion Press Association.

L. POST HISTORY AWARD - <u>1pm Friday of Convention.</u>

There are awards for one-year Post Histories and one-year Post Yearbooks. Information on "how-to" can be found in the Officer's Guide and Manual of Ceremonies. Entry forms may be found on the Department website under "Forms". Entries are due at the Convention Registration table no later than 1pm the Friday of Convention. Plaques will be awarded to the winners during Convention.

M. CHILDREN & YOUTH AWARDS

The following Children & Youth Awards are recognized by National Headquarters. Specific requirements for each award can be found in The American Legion Children & Youth Department Program guide, which is available on the National Website, www.legion.org

- 100% Post Children & Youth Reporting: District Award
- Outstanding Achievement In The Programs Of Children & Youth: Individual Award
- Most Outstanding Post Children & Youth Program: Post Award
- Dedicated Service To Our Nation's Children & Youth: Post Award

IV. SPECIAL INDIVIDUAL RECOGNITION/ACHIEVEMENT AWARD – <u>May 15th</u> A. THE GOLD BRIGADE

A Legionnaire who recruits **50 or more NEW MEMBERS** into The American Legion **by the May Target Date** will qualify for enrollment in the GOLD BRIGADE. These Legionnaires will be awarded unique gifts that designate affiliation with the Gold Brigade of The American Legion. Also, special recognition will be given to those Legionnaires enrolled in the Gold Brigade through special announcements in THE DISPATCH and in special articles in other publications. The National Commander will recognize members of the Gold Brigade during the National Convention. The gifts awarded to a Gold Brigadier will depend on the number of times they have qualified for this award. The first-time qualifier for the Gold Brigade will receive a choice of a designer jacket or sweater with the Gold Brigade logo on the left breast or polo shirt; a cap pin, a Gold Brigade patch for the blue blazer, and Gold Brigade certificate. A second, third or fourth time winner will receive a Gold Brigade Patch and certificate, a "hash mark" for the jacket sleeve, and the choice of either another designer jacket or a sweater with the Gold Brigade logo on the left breast or a polo shirt.

B. THE SILVER BRIGADE

A Legionnaire who recruits **25 to 49 NEW MEMBERS** into The American Legion **by the May Target Date** will qualify for this award. A silver pin and certificate will be awarded.

C. THE BRONZE BRIGADE

A Legionnaire who recruits **15-24 NEW MEMBERS** into The American Legion by the **May Target Date** will qualify for this award. A bronze pin and certificate will be awarded.

Multiple awards cannot be awarded in the same year. MUST BE CERTIFIED BY THE DEPT ADJUTANT by MAY 15, 2025.

V. MEMBERSHIP AWARDS

<u>Officer certifications must be completed for a Post to be eligible any award</u>. The Certification of Officers form is in this manual and online at the Dept website. Additionally, to be considered for an award, a Post must have a <u>minimum of 15 members</u> for both the current and the previous year. This can be waived by the Department Executive Committee if the Post is in good standing. Route all national awards through Dept. HQ.

A. TARGET DATE - VETERANS DAY 65% - November 14, 2025

Recruiter Award – A Legionnaire who recruits a new 2025 member by November 14th will have their name entered into a drawing. The winner from each district will receive a personalized coffee mug. The recruiter's name will be entered into the drawing one time for each new member recruited. Post adjutant or membership chairman will report the names of the recruiters to Dept HQ for all new members recruited. If member and recruiters' names are not forwarded by November 30th, the recruiter's name will not be in the drawing.

District Membership Chairman's Award – A personalized coffee mug will go to each District Membership Chairman who has no "goose egg" Posts and has enrolled at least 75 percent of his/her District's 2025 membership goal by the above target date.

Post Award – A certificate will be awarded to Posts that have met their 2025 membership goal by this target date.

B. TARGET DATE - NATIONAL MIDWINTER 80% - *January* 15, 2025

Special recognition for early Go-Getters - All Department Go-Getters who are certified to Department Head-quarters by their Post Adjutants by this target date will be entitled to attend the Go-Getters reception held at the Midwinter Conference. Each Go-Getter also will receive a Go-Getter star. (Go-Getters Certification Form)

Post Award - A special award will go to all Posts with five or more consecutive years at or beyond 90 percent of goal. Plaques and framed citations will be awarded for 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 45, and 50 consecutive years with attachments awarded for each intermediate year.

National Honor Ribbon Award - A Post honor ribbon will be awarded to all Posts whose 2025 membership by this target date is equal to or exceeds the total 2024 membership.

Meritorious Service Certificate - A Post will receive a certificate of meritorious service for equaling or surpassing its previous all-time high membership by this target date.

District Commander's Award - An award will go to each District Commander whose District has no "goose egg" Posts and the District has enrolled at least 90 percent of its assigned 2025 membership goal by this target date.

Department Vice Commander's Award – An award will go to each Department Vice Commander whose assigned districts have enrolled at least 90 percent of its assigned 2025 membership by this target date.

c. TARGET DATE - PRESIDENTS DAY 85% - February 12, 2025

Post Award – A Commander's ribbon will be presented to every Post that has reached 100% of its 2025 membership goal by this date.

D. TARGET DATE - AMERICAN LEGION BIRTHDAY 90% - March 12, 2025

District Membership Award - A \$200 cash award will go to each District that has enrolled, by this target date for 2025, at least 95% of that District's goal. (The money is to be used for a District project, program, or even as directed by the District Executive Committee.)

Post Go-Getter Medallion - Each Post that reaches or exceeds 95 percent of its assigned 2025 membership goal by The American Legion Birthday Target Date will receive a Post Go-Getter Medallion.

E. TARGET DATE - ARMED FORCES DAY 100% - May 14, 2025

District Commander's Award - Every District Commander with a 2025 District membership by this target date that equals or exceeds that District's membership at the 2025 Department Convention delegate strength target date will receive an award from the Department Commander.

Consecutive Years All-Time High Post Award - A citation will be awarded to each Post that has five or more Consecutive years at all-time high membership by this target date. Posts with more than five years consecutive all-time high performance will receive a citation from National Headquarters for each year that it continues to register an all-time high.

F. TARGET DATE - FINAL AWARD - June 1, 2025

Department Go-Getter Award - All Department Go-Getters who are certified to Department Headquarters by their Post Adjutants by this target date will be entitled to attend the Go-Getters reception held at the Department

Convention. Each Go-Getter also will receive a Go-Getter star. (Go-Getters Certification Form)

Special Go-Getter– Those who recruit 25, 50, 75, or 100 members are eligible for special recognition.

Individual Recruiter Award (2nd Half of the Year)- Legionnaires who recruit a new 2025 member starting November 15th will be entered into a drawing. A winner from each of the above categories will be selected to receive \$50. Recruiters will be entered into the drawing one time for each new member recruited. The Post Adjutant or Membership Chair will report the names of the recruiters along with the name of the new member to Dept HQ by Friday, June 1st, 2024.

Post Membership Award- Posts that meet the following criteria will be entered into a drawing for a \$200 award to be drawn at the Convention. One winner will be selected from each of the above membership categories. Posts will be entered one time when they meet all the criteria and one (1) additional time for every 1% over their goal.

- 1. Meet the minimum membership requirement of 15
- 2. Meet or exceed 85% of membership goal by Mid-Winter.
- 3. Meet or exceed 100% of membership goal June 1, 2025.
- 4. Meet or exceed 90% retention by June 1, 2025.
- 5. Submit on time their Post Data Report, Consolidated Post Report and Post Officer Certification.

Pride Of The Prairie Post Excellence Award – This recognizes a post in each goal group that completes the following requirements on time; Post Data Report, Consolidated Post Report, Officer Certification, Submit a Legionnaire of the Year package to their District Commander, and Achieves goal and the highest two-year membership

VI. MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL NOTICE SCHEDULE

At times members contact the Post or Department Headquarters asking why they have received a Renewal Notice from National Headquarters when they already paid their current year's membership dues. It is usually a case of crossing in the mail. Below is the 2025 Cutoff Dates and the Renewal Notice mailing schedule.

National Target Dates and National Cutoff Dates are not the same thing. **Target Dates** are used to determine eligibility in qualifying for Membership Awards. **Cutoff Dates** are the dates membership data is extracted from the National database for mailing the next renewal notices. If a membership is not processed at National HQ by the Cutoff Date, the member will receive another renewal notice, there is no way to stop it.

Remember that if you still rely on Department Headquarters for processing your dues, you must transmit the dues to Department Headquarters with sufficient time to allow processing by Department.

Department HQ sends all memberships into National HQ daily when they arrive in the mail using MyLegion.org.

X. LEGIONNAIRE OF THE YEAR

Each Post is authorized and urged to select a Post Legionnaire of the Year. This selection pays recognition and honor to a good worker. Additionally, by submitting a nomination to the District Commander the Post meets one of the eligibility requirements for the Pride of the Prairie Post Excellence Award.

Post's Legionnaire selection must be submitted to the District Commander at least <u>15 days prior to the Spring District Convention</u>. The District Executive Committee selects one of the Post Legionnaires of the Year as the District Legionnaire of the Year and announces at the District Convention. Post Commanders ensure the Post Legionnaire of the Year from their Post attends the District Convention to be recognized.
